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Grammar Focus: Study the contractions of the verb 'to be'.

 $Iam \rightarrow I'm$ You are \rightarrow You're He is \rightarrow He's She is \rightarrow She's

We are \rightarrow We're They are \rightarrow They're

Now, try making sentences with all of the contractions.

Grammar Focus II: Study the negative contractions of the verb 'to be'.

 $lam not \rightarrow l'm not$ You are not \rightarrow You're not / You aren't

He is not \rightarrow He's not / He isn't She is not \rightarrow She's not / She isn't

We are not → We're not / We aren't They are not → They're not / They aren't

Now, try making sentences with all of the contractions.

Grammar Focus III: Study the question forms of the verb 'to be'.

 $lam \rightarrow Am l...?$ You are \rightarrow Are you...? He is \rightarrow Is he...? She is \rightarrow Is she...?

We are \rightarrow Are we...? They are \rightarrow Are they...?
